RESEARCH PROJECTS 2021-2023

MACRO

MACRO: Mapping the Rheumatology Workforce in the Arab Region

This was the first study to estimate the number of current practicing rheumatologists in 16 Arab countries, to estimate the projected number of rheumatologists in 10 years, and to evaluate the current workload, practice profile, consultation waiting time, and geographical mobilities of these rheumatologists.

An ancillary study evaluated burnout syndrome in 445 rheumatologists and rheumatology fellows.





TACTIC

TACTIC: Translation and cross-cultural validation of the Psoriatic Arthritis Impact of Disease questionnaire (PsAID-12) in Arabic

The TACTIC steering committee translated and culturally adapted the PsAID-12 to Arabic using the World Health Organization methodology. The subsequent validation study included 554 patients from 13 Arab countries and allowed Arab-speaking patients with PsA to be evaluated in clinical practice using PsAID-12 and to be included in international clinical trials. The manuscript is now submitted to an international peer-reviewed journal.

Several ancillary studies are derived from the TACTIC project:

- Concordance between the patient and physician's evaluation of disease activity
- · Comorbidity study in patients with PsA
- Impact of gender on PsAID and other patient-reported outcomes

RESEARCH PROJECTS 2023-2025



The ALFA program "ARCH-ArLAR REFERRAL PROGRAM will be conducted by the ARCH with the support of a research grant from Pfizer.

Its objectives include


- Design and validate a referral algorithm for early arthritis in the Arab countries.
- Disseminate the referral algorithm through a series of webinars and workshops.
- Evaluate the impact of the referral program on the diagnostic delay in chronic inflammatory rheumatic diseases.

Several publications will be derived from this program.

The first study will validate a referral algorithm to

The first study will validate a referral algorithm for primary care physicians to guide them about the optimal referral of patients with rheumatic and musculoskeletal diseases to rheumatology. It will be conducted in 8 Arab countries with the collaboration of primary care physicians.

The second study will evaluate the current referral delay in rheumatology clinics and the impact of the awareness campaign to launch in 2024 in all Arab countries on this referral delay.

BMJ – UCSF Research to Publication

The ARCH offered 100 registrations to young rheumatologists from 16 Arab countries to the prestigious BMJ-UCSF research to publication program.

The program was completed by 93 participants from March 2022 until May 2023.

Two webinars were conducted in the middle and at the end of the program, to accompany the participants in their learning journey.


